RESPONSE TO SOCIAL IMPACTS

Anglo American appointed Ernst & Young to conduct a community impact study to understand the social impacts of the closure of Gibihi Road. As part of the study, Ernst & Young spoke to over 250 members of the community, and have followed up with those directly impacted to discuss next steps.

Anglo American has commenced measures to address the impacts caused by the closure of Gibihi Road and to demonstrate our ongoing commitment to the community, including:

1. Discussions with landholders

Anglo American has begun discussions with directly impacted landholders to understand costs that may be incurred due to the road closure.

2. \$1 Million Moura Community Fund

Dawson Mine established a community fund, with \$1 million to be provided to the Moura community over two years (2018-2019) in recognition of social impacts. This funding will be available for projects to immediately provide economic stimulus or enhance the amenity of Moura.

The \$1 million funding is over and above existing community commitments and Dawson Mine's ongoing community program and will be administered by a newly established Dawson Community Reference Forum (please see reverse for further information).

3. Buy local voucher

In recognition of the impacts the closure of Gibihi Road has had on our employees, and in response to the potential impact on some local businesses, Anglo American employees who travel from Moura to work will receive a \$750 gift card to spend only in the Moura region. Anglo American will be engaging with local businesses to discuss their involvement.

4. Transport

Buses are currently running from Moura to the mine site to reduce traffic on the roads at peak times and to reduce costs for our employees. We will continue to review the effectiveness of the bus service in consultation with our employees.

DAWSON COMMUNITY REFERENCE FORUM

A newly formed Dawson Community Reference Forum has been established to provide an ongoing way for Dawson mine to connect with the community about operational, community and other related matters. The Forum will also provide recommendations to Dawson mine on the allocation of the \$1 million Moura Community Fund.

Responding to feedback from the community and following a recommendation made at the first meeting of the Forum this week, \$150,000 from the Moura Community Fund will be provided to enable the completion of the Moura Memorial.

Chaired by Dawson Mine, General Manager, Clarence Robertson, the Forum comprises members of the local community, including:

ROAD ACCESS UPDATE

Anglo American has continued to work closely with Banana Shire Council to finalise plans for a new road to be built in the vicinity of the old Three Chain Road.

The replacement road will be a significant piece of critical infrastructure for the region for decades to come. Anglo American has also made a commitment to the community to maximise local procurement during the road project to ensure economic benefits flow to the Moura region.

In conjunction with Banana Shire Council, Anglo American continues to upgrade and maintain the standard of the Kianga diversion road and undertake repair work on the Theodore Highway. 24/7 monitoring of Kianga Road also continues to be in place.
