COMPLETED ROUND ONE WORKS FOR QUEENSLAND FUNDING 2017–19

Works for Queensland is grant money given to Council to stimulate jobs in regional Queensland, without the requirement for Council to co-fund. The 2017–19 Works for Queensland program supports regional councils, such as the Banana Shire Council, to undertake job-creating maintenance and minor infrastructure projects.

Last financial year the Banana Shire Council was granted \$1.73 from Round One Works for Queensland (W4Q) program funding.

The nine projects undertaken using these funds were:

SES Building (Biloela) \$300,000 Pest/Weed and Road Verge Management – Willows Cactus, Parkinsonia and Harrisia Cactus (Shire-wide) \$300,000 Bikeways and Walkways (Biloela and Moura) \$220,000 Callide Dam Playground (Biloela) \$130,000 Secondary Disaster Centre Power (Biloela Library) \$70,000 Water Treatment Plant Admin/Amenities (Moura) \$40,000 Demountable Skate Park (Whole Shire) \$50,000 Beef Road - Dust Seals (North West of Taroom) \$500,000 Moura Miners Memorial Project (Moura) \$120,000

Council has targeted projects which are important, but due to higher priorities funds have previously been unavailable.

Council would like to thank the State Government for the Works for Queensland funding received in this completed round, round one, as well as funds received in the current round, round two. These projects created economic benefit and job stimulus across the Shire.
