iIntroduction

PURPOSE

This growth and development will be considered in a wide range of areas that are mentioned in this document. These areas such as Arts, Sports and Youth are integral to the development of the shire and its occupants.

METHODOLOGY

The Banana Shire Council has identified that a "Place Based" Community Plan is required in each of the Shire's twelve towns. This will allow us to develop a positive trend regarding population growth as well as fulfilling the potential of the individual community's economic and social future.

From the development of the "Place Based" plans the Banana Shire Strategic Community Plan will be developed.

In summation, the consultation process will include:

- Gathering of and referral to available ABS statistics;
- Discussion of related issues and policy with Government Departments and key stakeholder representatives;
- Meetings with representatives from regional organisations that have economic development roles;
- Attendance at meetings, networking or speaking to local leaders and community groups;

- Research/referral to a variety of regional strategic planning/consultancies currently in progress;

- Community Engagement processes with residents in the Shire;
- Related Internet Search.

LOCATION

The township of Goovigen is located approximately 43km from Biloela in Central Queensland.

HISTORY

Goovigen (Aboriginal for Box Tree) was originally set up as a supply depot for the railways. It now forms an intricate part of a rich agricultural area.

DESCRIPTION

Goovigen has a population of 250 including surrounding cotton/grain/cattle properties.

The turn-off to the town is located just north of the township of Jambin on the Burnett Highway. The topography and soils make Goovigen ideal for irrigation and dry land farming. The land is suitable for grazing, horticulture and a wide range of both summer and winter crops.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF KEY CENSUS RESULTS

In the 2011 Census, there were 212 people in Goovigen (State Suburbs) of these 52.4% were male and 47.6% were female. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people made up 0.0% of the population, compared with 2.3% Indigenous persons in Australia.

COMMUNITY IDENTITY & VISION

Today: Goovigen is a residential community that supports the promotion of their town as an affordable and safe place to live, while providing services to the surrounding rural industries.

Future: Goovigen sees the future sustainability of the community through the opportunities created by attracting young families to live in the area. Tourism development, especially attracting travellers, is seen as being a benefit to existing businesses.

COMMUNITY PLAN

Youth Activity

In order to attract new families as well as retain current residents of the area, facilities for youth activities are advisable. There is an opportunity to construct multiple facilities such as a playground and skate park as well as multipurpose areas. The organisation of a youth group as well as partnering with other communities is another opportunity for the area.

Residential Land

One of the primary concerns for the Goovigen area that needs to be addressed is the use of residential land. Both urban expansion and population growth is deeply affected by this as affordability and suitability impact greatly on the future of the area.

The encouragement of this process to be as practical as possible would be advisable. The issue of water usage, quality and access also needs to be addressed.

The development of lifestyle blocks would assist in attracting new residents

Community Amenity

As with all other communities, the local amenities are of the utmost importance to current and future residents and as such it is important to consider and plan for the maintenance and development of these amenities such as:

- independent living
- recycling
- health support

Developing the local Progress Association as a leadership organisation in the area is an important step in empowering the community. The development of partnerships with the local school to make use of facilities for sporting, IT access and training is also advisable.

Community Hall

The Community Hall is a fantastic asset to the community. It has great potential to be a catalyst for events for tourist/visitors. Ongoing improvements need to be made to the hall including:

- Painting interior and exterior
- Storage
- Upgrading septic system
- Coffee machine

Tourism

There is great potential for tourism in Goovigen. It has become a point of focus for the town, as it is with other communities within the Banana Shire. Tourism has the potential to be of substantial benefit to Goovigen. An example of this is the Golden Park Retreat and the work being done by the community at the showgrounds.

Tourism in the area will continue to increase by attracting the growing number of "grey nomads" using facilities as well as the local history as told through tourist drives and the local museum. To assist in the growth of tourism the community is focused on installing or upgrading:

- Dump point
- New amenities block at the showgrounds
- Signage on the Burnett and Leichhardt Highways
- Signage in Goovigen

- Directional signage to Stone's Crescent
- Scenic Route

Lake Victoria is an underutilised area and requires planning that will see the area developed. Suggestions have included:

- Rubbish bins
- Toilets
- Picnic furniture
- Upgrading of access

Rural Sustainability

As the mines will not be a viable industry in the area forever, steps must be taken and alternatives considered for future generations.
