i Introduction

PURPOSE

Also, this plan aims to develop a long-term strategy for the growth and development of the Banana Shire. This growth and development will be considered in a wide range of areas that are mentioned in this document. These areas such as Arts, Sports and Youth are considered to be integral to the development of the Shire and its occupants.

METHODOLOGY

The Banana Shire Council has identified that a "Place Based" Community Plan is required in each of the Shire's twelve towns. This will allow us to develop a positive trend regarding population growth as well as fulfilling the potential of the individual community's economic and social future.

From the development of the "Place Based" plans the Banana Shire Strategic Community Plan will be developed.

In summation, the consultation process will include:

- Discussion of related issues and policy with Government Departments and key stakeholder representatives;
- Meetings with representatives from regional organisations that have economic development roles;

- Community Engagement processes with residents in the Shire;
- Related Internet Search.

LOCATION

The town of Wowan is located 82km southwest of the city of Rockhampton, 72km north of Biloela and 609km northwest of Brisbane.

HISTORY

Wowan was the first town established on the Dawson Valley Railway Line. The name is of Aboriginal origin meaning scrub turkey and was given by the Railway Department on the 16th October 1912. W.H. Flowers surveyed the township some eighteen months later.

Dry land cotton was the Valley's first commercial crop used to cater for a shortage of cotton in the British Mills after World War One. Australia's first Cotton Growers Association was Wowan's Dawson Valley Branch. This organisation was instrumental in persuading the British Australia Cotton Association to open a ginnery in Wowan in 1922. Plummeting prices forced the closure after just one season despite processing one million pounds of seed cotton in its first year.

In 1927 the Wowan Show Society held its first event giving the Society the proud record of being the first show in the Dawson & Callide Valleys (excluding Banana show in 1868).

As the result of a far-sighted group of locals who worked tirelessly for the area, Wowan had the Shire's first butter factory and cotton ginnery. The same energy and desire is evident amongst the people of Wowan and its surrounds today.

The list of recognised Community achievements is long and varied with the Multipurpose Centre one of many success stories made possible due to the drive and energy of the local community.

DESCRIPTION

Perched on the bank of Pocket Creek, Wowan is rich with native flora and fauna. Wowan is bordered by mountains to the south and west with Mt Wheal being the largest.

Wowan offers visitors the opportunity to experience the friendly rural lifestyle that the residents enjoy. There are a wide variety of leisure activities including golf, bowls, cricket and gliding.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF KEY CENSUS RESULTS

In the 2011 Census there were 233 persons usually resident in Wowan. 51.9% were males and 48.1% were females. Of the total population in Wowan 7.7% were Indigenous persons, compared with 2.3% Indigenous persons in Australia.

COMMUNITY IDENTITY & VISION

Vision for Wowan

Today: Wowan is a supportive, safe and affordable community that has a strong focus on its elderly population and history.

Future: Wowan's focus for the future is to maintain its health and community services, including its primary school, through the attraction and retention of a holistic demographic mix including younger families and retirees. Wowan residents see the benefit of travellers stopping in the town and supporting their existing businesses. They also see the opportunity in attracting new resource industries to use Wowan as a residential dormitory town.

COMMUNITY PLAN

Infrastructure

While the infrastructure of Wowan faces numerous challenges, it also offers multiple opportunities for the enhancement of the area.

Local roads in the area require upgrading, repairs or sealing.



Water is another issue of great importance to the Wowan community. The town water quality is substandard with many residents reporting damage to personal infrastructure such as piping and hot water systems.

A potential solution to this issue is the installation or subsidisation of rainwater tanks.

The river, while being an integral and iconic part of the community, has a number of issues surrounding it.

Flood control methods need to be considered and put into place. Cleaning of Dee River, Pocket Creek and Black Gully including the removal of leucaena is critical.

Tourism

Wowan has the potential to be a stop- over of choice for tourists. To achieve this, a variety of steps could be taken including:

- Being acknowledged as an RV friendly town via the organisations that undertake such judgements
- Improving local signage
- Supporting the local Historical Society and Tourism Advisory Committee
- Embracing the history of the town
- Partnering with the town of Dululu and pooling resources

Community

As with all communities, the facilities, services and opportunities in the area are of high importance when attempting to attract and retain families and residents. To encourage the growth of the area, services such as aged care, youth facilities and activities, as well as the retention of emergency services needs to be a priority and receive funding when required.

The availability of housing and the opportunity to build or purchase property in the area is also a concern for the community. With many empty houses in the area, the purchase of houses needs to be encouraged. A possible solution is partnering with Cockatoo Mine and the Council.

Other opportunities for the town are:

- The strengthening of the relationship between Dululu and Wowan
- Improving communication between residents and Council
