



Infrastructure and Planning

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Strategy

Banana Shire provides the infrastructure base for a 16,000 resident population and an estimated market population of 25,000.

Rationale

Essential infrastructure, high environmental amenity and good access to a well qualified and well connected labour force are key requirements that both local and regional businesses look for in establishing or remaining in the region.

Key Strategic Outcomes & Tasks

High standards in infrastructure development and maintenance are critical to sustain Banana Shire's economic and geographical advantages to the business community. Key Strategic Outcomes and Tasks to ensure that Banana Shire maintains and grows its competitive advantage include:

- **Monitor the infrastructure needs** of local industry and business sectors and encourage the private sector and all other levels of government to prioritise and align infrastructure implementation programs and funding to key economic development and employment projects for the region;
- **Foster opportunities for joint infrastructure projects** in cooperation with business and industry groups, government agencies and other local government;
- **Ensure adequate supply of available land** for residential, commercial and industrial purposes that supports a diverse local and regional economy and promotes economic growth;
- **Encourage and promote partnership in water infrastructure** development ensuring sufficient water for sustainable growth.
- **Promote the availability of infrastructure and facilities** which may influence the ability to attract and retain businesses and population across the region;
- **Research critical infrastructure needs for key growth** industries in the region and identify and prioritise immediate infrastructure deficiencies;
- **Pursue improvements to and application of communication technology** in the region and encourage all new developments to have advanced communications/technological infrastructure available such as the National Broadband Network;
- **Promote the development of aerodrome infrastructure** in the Banana Shire as an opportunity for business expansion in the aviation related industry and to support other business/industry expansion/investment;
- **Encourage sustainable development** and environmentally friendly business practices which protect and maintain the local natural environment and existing infrastructure, facilities and amenity;
- **Encourage and promote partnerships with State and Federal governments** and agencies in respect of infrastructure needs of local businesses and for future investment in infrastructure (such as transport links, roads, broadband access and phone coverage).

Roads

Banana Shire has an extensive road network with 3931 km of shire roads and 490 km of state roads. The road network is a major catalyst to the economic future of shire. The condition of the state road network is a major concern; bridges at Dululu (Burnett Highway), Roundstone Creek (Dawson Highway) and Sheep Station Creek (Dawson Highway) have major impediments to growth within the shire.

Understanding fully that the improvement in one area will bring higher impact into another area highlights the need to manage the State Road network in a holistic regional manner.

The upgrading of the Calliope Range will increase B Double and B Triple truck movements in Biloela, Banana, Theodore and Taroom facilitating the need to build heavy transport routes around these communities and the upgrading of Dawson and Leichhardt Intersection at Banana.

Rail

Rail is a major concern within the region. The removal of freight from rail for the replacement of coal will prove to be a poor decision by government that will have a long term negative impact on the economic stability of the region.

Poor or no investment into intermodal services has increased the need to transport more bulk commodities by road; during the 2010/2011 wet weather this decision placed immense pressure on the state road network causing unprecedented damage.

The exclusion of rail from the Queensland Infrastructure Plan (QIP) is seen as a backward step and one that the region will suffer from.

Banana Shire is seeking the investigation into the construction of intermodal sites at Dakenda and with the Gladstone region, these sites need to be developed with a 20 to 30 year horizon to ensure the sustainability of industries beyond mining.
