ABOUT THE ARTIST:

Susan Cook is a proud elder and Aboriginal Artist from the Iman Tribe. As an Aboriginal descendant, Susan is very close to the earth and the animals on it. "I like to draw my animals with bright colours and happy faces because even though they all look so different they are all friends together and each animal has something good to teach all the other animals and us. As an Aborigine we believe that all people, all animals and all things on this earth are here to help one another'.

Susan is a descendant of Mary Ann, (mother of Maggie Dunn), who is recognised as one of the traditional caretakers in the Taroom area. Susan and her husband moved to Taroom in December 2019, now living in their home on the same hill, Bonners Knobb, where her tribe would often camp and within a few kilometres of the Ah See Lagoon, off the Dawson river, so-named after her Great Grandfather and Great Grandmother who raised their family there and fed the Taroom locals from their market gardens that they had there. It is here in Taroom where Susan gets much of her Spiritual and Artistic inspiration.

Susan says that she does not so much "do" a painting but rather she thinks about her ancestors and their lives and the painting "emerges". Susan painstakingly completes her indigenous art using a stick and thickened acrylic paint, producing an interesting layered painting that tends to "pop out".

Susan will be exhibiting her work at "The NAIDOC Star of Taroom" event to be held at the Taroom Showgrounds on Saturday 23 July 2022.
