1 Introduction

Background

Redleaf Group was engaged by Banana Shire Council to facilitate Aboriginal Party cultural heritage site surveys and monitoring with the details as shown in Table 1 and mapped in Map 1 (Appendix B). Different areas of the project are in various stages of completion. Some areas of the road remain unsurveyed, while ground disturbing activities have commenced in others. This memorandum aims to consolidate the cultural heritage recommendations and provide clarity moving forward.

The Schedule 15 – Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Identification Reports ('Schedule 15') have been filled out inconsistently thus far. In particular, paragraph 1 of the Schedule 15 has been completed incorrectly in many instances, unintentionally providing an 'unconditional clearance' for future works. Because of the subsequent recommendations contained in the Schedule 15 documents, it is assumed that these recommendations supersede the 'unconditional clearance'.


Paragraph 4 of the Schedule 15 document also appears to have been completed inconsistently. It appears that some tick boxes were checked as contingencies. The written recommendations provide more guidance on the actual mitigation strategies that must be followed. For example, the tick box 'A fence is to be erected to prevent access on or around an area of cultural significance' has been checked in several forms, yet no areas have been specified to be fenced off.

1.1 Cultural Heritage Body

In accordance with the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003* and the *Torres Strait Islander Cultural Heritage Act 2003* (the Acts) and *Native Title Act 1993*, the appropriate Cultural Heritage Body for this area is the Wardingarri Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC – Iman People #2 (Appendix A).



2 Schedule 15 – Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Identification Reports

Over the course of surveying and monitoring of works, six Schedule 15 documents have been produced, as of the 25th April 2025. Their details are as follows:

2.1 Schedule 15 #1: 25-27 February 2025

Completed by Iman Representatives and Redleaf Group Archaeologists

Applicable Extents:

'Section 1' started -25.692830, 149.211359 finished -25.687154, 149.220024.

'Section 2' started -25.632593, 149.322226 finished -25.635066, 149.226593.

Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- Monitors are employed during work in the location of identified Aboriginal Cultural Heritage.
- The work project is to avoid specified areas.
- A fence is to be erected to prevent access on or around an area of cultural significance.
- An expert is to be engaged to evaluate and document the general location of a cultural heritage find.
- The Iman People relocate a cultural heritage find made.
- Request of an Iman representative/cultural heritage officer to be present prior & during any earth works or construction works.

Comments:

While there is a recommendation to 'avoid specified areas', no areas were specified by the Iman representatives. Similarly, no area was specified in relation to the recommendation to erect a fence. Redleaf Group archaeologists and an Everick Heritage archaeologist recorded all artefacts. All recorded artefacts were relocated to a mitigation site/keeping place at -25.633170, 149.226176. The final recommendation concerns the need for monitoring by Iman representatives during works, while the recommendation states 'earth works or construction works', this measure should extend to all ground disturbing activities.

Note: Paragraph 1 of the Schedule 15 has been completed, which provides for an 'unconditional clearance' for future works. However, because of the subsequent recommendations contained in the Schedule 15 documents, it is assumed that these recommendations supersede the 'unconditional clearance'.

2.2 Schedule 15 #2: 13-14 March 2025



Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- Monitors are employed during work in the location of identified Aboriginal Cultural Heritage.
- The work project is to avoid specified areas.
- A fence is to be erected to prevent access on or around an area of cultural significance.
- An expert is to be engaged to evaluate and document the general location of a cultural heritage find.
- The Iman People relocate a cultural heritage find made.
- Request of an Iman representative/cultural heritage officer to be present prior & during any earth works or construction works.

Comments: The previous comments relating to Schedule 15 #1 are also applicable to Schedule 15 #2.

Note: Paragraph 1 of the Schedule 15 has been completed, which provides for an 'unconditional clearance' for future works. However, because of the subsequent recommendations contained in the Schedule 15 documents, it is assumed that these recommendations supersede the 'unconditional clearance'.



2.3 Schedule 15 #3: 8 April 2025

Completed by Iman Representatives and Banana Shire Council Representatives

Applicable Extents:

'Section 4' started at -25.649260, 149.337839 finished at -25.658198, 149.346249

Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- The Iman People relocate a cultural heritage find made.

Comments: The artefacts were moved further from the road and their relocated co-ordinates recorded in the Report. While the Iman Representatives did not include the need for monitoring in relation to this area, the most recently completed report, Schedule 15 #6, recommends that monitoring occur for 'any ground disturbance in all areas.' Redleaf Group considers a site-wide recommendation for monitoring of ground disturbance to be sensible, considering the abundance of artefacts observed in the landscape.

Note: Paragraph 1 of the Schedule 15 has been completed, which provides for an 'unconditional clearance' for future works. However, because of the subsequent recommendations contained in the Schedule 15 documents, it is assumed that these recommendations supersede the 'unconditional clearance'.

2.4 Schedule 15 #4: 9-10 April 2025

Completed by Iman Representatives and Banana Shire Council Representatives

Applicable Extents:

'Roadside Pit' approximate point on road at -25.632653, 149.322231

Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- Monitoring was conducted during the construction of the roadside pit, as construction of pit has not finished cultural monitors will need to return to monitor to finish works in roadside pit.

Comments: While no cultural heritage values were observed, monitoring will continue to be required for further works in the 'roadside pit'.

Note: Paragraph 1 of the Schedule 15 has been completed, which provides for an 'unconditional clearance' for future works. However, because of the subsequent recommendations contained in the Schedule 15 documents, it is assumed that these recommendations supersede the 'unconditional clearance'.

2.5 Schedule 15 #5: 11 April 2025

Completed by Iman Representatives and Banana Shire Council Representatives


Applicable Extents:

'Section 5' started at -25.658198, 149.346249 finished at -25.666816, 149.352430. **Note:** The recorded GPS co-ordinates and reference to 'section 2' in the Report recommendations are incorrect.

Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- None found - work to proceed.

Comments: While the Iman Representatives did not include the need for monitoring in relation to this area, the most recently completed report, Schedule 15 #6, recommends that monitoring occur for 'any ground disturbance in all areas.' Redleaf Group considers a site-wide recommendation for monitoring of ground disturbance to be sensible, considering the abundance of artefacts observed in the landscape.



2.6 Schedule 15 #6: 14-17 April 2025

Completed by Iman Representatives and Redleaf Group Archaeologist


It is assumed that the recommendations of this Schedule 15 are applicable to the entirety of the project area and are to be considered together with the original recommendations for each section.

A vehicle field survey was conducted within 'Section 2' identified by the 'Schedule 15 #1 – 25-27 February 2025' document where unmonitored tree removal has occurred.

Recommendations from the Schedule 15:

- Monitors are employed during work in the location of identified Aboriginal Cultural Heritage.
- A fence is to be erected to prevent access on or around an area of cultural significance.
- An expert is to be engaged to evaluate and document the general location of a cultural heritage find.
- The Iman People to relocate a cultural heritage find made.
- Monitoring behind (100 m) bulldozers pushing trees.
- Monitor any ground disturbance in all areas.
- Briefing at the beginning of monitoring to know where and what works are occurring during that period.
- Mapping to be made available to allow Iman to mark off areas as required.
- More monitors to be employed depending on how much work is to occur.

Comments: Both recorded artefacts were relocated to the mitigation site/keeping place at -25.633170, 149.226176. Monitoring should be conducted for all ground disturbing activities across the entirety of the site, which includes the removal of trees and their root systems. Pre-work briefing, the generation of mapping and employment of additional monitors have been recommended to ensure efficiency and that all personnel involved understand when and where work and mitigation will occur.




3 Overall Recommendations

Cultural Heritage Values/Artefacts were found in many areas during surveys (Appendix C & Appendix E). There is a relatively high concentration of artefacts within the landscape. These artefacts must be protected from harm due to the duty of care created under the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003*.

The recommendations below must be followed before and during the proposed works:

- **Monitoring:** Monitoring is required. Iman representatives are to be present prior to and during any ground disturbance, including the removal of mature vegetation.
- **Cultural Heritage Awareness Training:** Personnel should be provided with relevant cultural heritage awareness training to ensure they understand the Duty of Care requirements under the ACH Act, and the potential Aboriginal Cultural Heritage values that may be found in the landscape.
- **Finds Procedure:** During road upgrade activities, should any objects be discovered or unearthed that appear to be of Aboriginal origin, the site operator must stop works immediately and notify the relevant Aboriginal Party to determine if any further actions are necessary. The following procedure, from the Department of Transport and Main Roads (DTMR) guidelines, should be followed:
 1. **FIND:** An item of potential Cultural Heritage is found
 2. **STOP:** All work at the Find location shall cease. The item shall not be removed or disturbed
 3. **NOTIFY:** The Contractor shall immediately notify Council.
 4. **MANAGE:** This may include securing the finds by erecting an exclusion zone for a period and precluding access to that area. The Contractor shall notify all site personnel of the object and / or area and proposed treatment of the object and / or area as soon as possible, but prior to commencing work on the next working day. Please immediately notify the responsible cultural heritage officer should further historical or Indigenous heritage values be identified.

Note: The recommendations provided in this report do not preclude adherence to the ACH Act and the need for an appropriate Environmental Management Plan (EMP), which identifies steps to be taken in the event of previously unidentified cultural heritage values being found while undertaking the proposed works.



Glossary

Cultural Heritage Body: An entity registered under Part 4 of the Cultural Heritage Acts as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage body for an area. The purpose of a cultural heritage body is to:

- identify the Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander parties for an area
- serve as the first point of contact for cultural heritage matters.

Cultural Heritage Management Plan (CHMP): An agreement between a land user (sponsor) and Traditional Owners (endorsed party) developed under Part 7 of the Cultural Heritage Acts. The CHMP explains how land use activities can be managed to avoid or minimise harm to Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage.

Cultural Heritage Party: Refers to a native title party for an area. A native title party is defined as:

- Registered native title holders (where native title has been recognised by the Federal Court of Australia).
- Registered native title claimants (whose native title claims are currently before the Federal Court of Australia).
- Previously registered native title claimants (the 'last claim standing') are native title claims that are no longer active and have been removed from the Register of Native Title Claims administered by the National Native Title Tribunal. Previously registered native title claimants will continue to be the native title party for that area providing:
 - o there is no other registered native title claimant for the area; and
 - o there is not, and never has been, a registered native title holder for the area.

The native title party maintains this status within the external boundaries of the claim even if native title has been extinguished.

Cultural heritage site points (pre 2015): Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage sites and places recorded in the database as point data **before** 1 July 2015.

Cultural heritage site points (post 2015): Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage sites and places recorded in the database as point data **after** 1 July 2015.

Cultural heritage site points (post 2015 mitigated): Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage sites and places recorded in the database as point data after 1 July 2015 where the recorder has advised the department that the site has been mitigated.

Cultural heritage site polygons: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage sites and places recorded in the database as a polygon.

Designated Landscape Areas (DLA): Under the repealed *Cultural Record (Landscapes Queensland and Queensland Estate) Act 1987*, an area was declared a 'designated landscape area' (DLA) if it was deemed necessary or desirable for it to be preserved or to regulate access.

Indigenous Protected Areas (IPA): Areas of land and sea managed by Indigenous groups as protected areas for biodiversity conservation through voluntary agreements with the Australian Government. 




Map 1 - Injune Road Project Progress



1 Introduction

Redleaf Group Pty Ltd has been advised by Banana Shire Council that culverts along Injune Road are to be replaced. A Cultural Heritage Desktop Assessment has been carried out along the entirety of the proposed project area, and Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Officers have monitored works that have occurred over the past few months. This memorandum will focus on the culverts themselves and the cultural heritage recommendations for their replacement. A map of the locations of the culverts can be found in Appendix A.

2 Recommendations


Initial cultural heritage surveys with the registered Aboriginal Party (Iman People #2) have occurred along Injune Road with numerous cultural heritage values discovered. If works on the culverts are to be contained within their original footprint, then no further cultural heritage assessment/monitoring will be required. However, if works will disturb new ground not originally disturbed when the existing culverts were inserted, then Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Officers will be required to be present to monitor works. Examples of disturbing new ground would be if widening the culverts outside of the original footprint or placing them deeper into the ground, is to occur.




3 Conclusion

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Officers representing the registered Aboriginal Party (Iman People #2) have previously surveyed the proposed culvert areas on Injune Road and have recommended:

- If works are to occur entirely within the footprint of the existing culverts, no further Aboriginal Cultural Heritage assessment or monitoring is required.
- If works are to occur outside the footprint of the existing culverts, this disturbance of new ground is required to be monitored. New ground disturbance consists of areas being disturbed that are not within the original footprint of the existing culverts. This disturbance may occur through widening of the culvert, and/or deepening the culvert.
- Whether monitoring is to occur or not, all activity relating to the proposed works must adhere to Site Management Protocols outlined in Appendix B. These protocols apply within all areas, regardless of all other conclusions and recommendations.



Appendix B - Site Management Protocols

Site Inductions

Provide machinery and road/traffic personnel with relevant cultural heritage training to ensure they:

- Understand the Duty of Care requirements under the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003*.
- Understand their obligations under the *Queensland Heritage Act 1992*.
- Understand where machinery, stockpiles etc. should be located.
- The site induction can be delivered by the responsible Cultural Heritage Officer (Tim Menkins 0497 259 960).

Finds Procedure

1. FIND: An item of potential cultural heritage value is found.
2. STOP: All work at the FIND location shall cease. The item shall not be removed or disturbed and an exclusion zone must be installed around the area.
3. NOTIFY: The Contractor shall immediately notify a 'responsible person'.
4. MANAGE: This may include restricting access to that area and liaison with relevant Aboriginal party/parties.

The Contractor shall notify all site personnel of the object and/or area and proposed treatment of the object and/or area as soon as possible, but prior to commencing work on the next working day. Please immediately notify the responsible Cultural Heritage Officer should further historical or Aboriginal heritage values be identified (Redleaf Group Pty Ltd 1300 562 494).

Note: These guidelines were developed using the Department of Environment, Tourism, Science, and Innovation (DETSI) 'Procedural Guide for Managing Indigenous Cultural Heritage' and can be used for both Aboriginal and non-Indigenous cultural heritage.

Archaeological Discoveries

Archaeological discoveries can occur regardless of land tenure. Refer to section 1 for the legislative framework relevant to the proposed development. In certain situations, an Archaeological Management plan may be required to achieve compliance. Archaeological Management Plans outline the steps to follow in the event of previously unidentified cultural heritage values being found during proposed works.

Note: The recommendations provided in this report do not preclude adherence to relevant cultural heritage legislation, including, but not limited to; the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003*, *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* and the *Queensland Heritage Act 1992*.
